Shimabara Castle

Shimabara Castle was built by Matsukura Bungo-no-kami Shigemasa, it took seven years to construct and was completed in 1624. The reconstructed keep of the castle was converted into a museum and historic artifacts related to local Christians, and other documents on local history and folklore are exhibited. In the area around the castle, you can also see a display of Christian gravestones, as well as the statue of Amakusa Shiro, created by the master sculptor Kitamura Seibo.



The History of Old Samurai Houses (in Teppo-machi)

When Shimabara Castle was constructed, the Houses for lower-ranking samurais who received 70 koku in salary were built in the area west of the Castle's outer wall. Many of these samurais were foot soldiers who mainly used guns. This is why the area was named Teppo-machi (gun town). Abundant spring water runs through the waterway in the center of the street. This waterway was conserved by residents as a source of water for daily use.

2 Shinozuka House

The Masters of the Shinozuka Family inherited the name of Junemon. Their ancestors were originally from Fukouzu, Mikawa (present-day Aichi Prefecture). Until the early Meiji period the family continued to the 11th generation. Their Master received the salary of 8-13 koku (an amount able to sustain one person a year) for two people. They mainly worked as secretaries or magistrates.

Yamamoto House

Sagozaemon, the founder of the Yamamoto Family, served the Matsudaira Family from the era of Matsudaira Tadatoshi (the Lord of Yoshida Castle) in Mikawa (present-day Aichi Prefecture), the father of Matsudaira Tadafusa. When the 6th lord, Tadahiro, was moved to another domain in 1749 and then to Shimabara in 1774, the Yamamoto Family accompanied him. The Yamamoto Family continued to serve 13 lords of the Matsudaira Family until the end of the Edo period.

Torita House

The Torita Family is a very old family that goes back to the early days of the Matsudaira Family. The Torita Family moved to Shimabara in 1669. This residence was built in a residential area for middle-to-lower ranking samurais. The area is divided into around 300 mf sites. Each family planted fruit trees such as loquat, persimmon and citrus trees in their gardens.

3 Gamadas Dome (Mt. Unzen Volcano Museum)

The main facility at the Unzen Volcanic Area UNESCO Global Geopark, Gamadas Dome was the first experience-based volcano museum in Japan. Here you can experience firsthand through a permanent exhibition the realities of the Mt. Unzen-Fugen eruption that occurred from 1990 through projection mapping and drone footage taken at the time. In the Wonder Lab you can learn about volcanoes, science and disaster prevention. There is also a kid's geopark where children can experience the wonders of Mt. Unzen.

Heisei-Shinzan Nature Center

Heisei Shinzan Nature Center is at the very foot of Mt. Heisei Shinzan, on the Taruki Plateau, only 2.5 km away from the summit of the mountain. From 1990, the Taruki Plateau was directly hit by pyroclastic flows caused by the volcanic activity of Fugendake Peak and devastating damage was caused. However, the plateau has amazingly revived. Today, visitors to the center can observe and study how the plateau has revived, and wild plants, birds and insects have returned.

5 Mt. Heisei Shinzan

The volcanic activity devastated the Shimabara Peninsula, especially Shimabara City and former Fukae-machi. The main factors that caused damage were pyroclastic flows and mudflows, which were caused by accumulated volcanic ash and sediment, brought down by flash floods triggered by torrential rain. The Mizunashi River and the Senbongi Area, to where these pyroclastic flows and mudflows ran, were heavily damaged.

While the volcanic activity continued, there was a fear of the partial collapse of Mayuyama (This was the cause of the disaster in 1792). However this time, Mayuyama protected the downtown area of Shimabara City from

pyroclastic flows.

6 Shimabara Mayuyama Road

Shimabara Mayuyama Road opened in March 2000. It is an 8 km-long prefectural road that bypasses Mayuyama in the west of Shimabara City and leads to National Route 57. The road runs very close to Mt. Heisei Shinzan.

Along the road there is the Heisei Shinzan Observatory Park, from where you can view the dramatic landscape created by the dynamic power of nature such as pyroclastic flows and mudflows as well as huge sand control dams.

On 21 May 1792, Mayuyama in the west of the castle town of Shimabara began collapsing, triggered by an earthquake that occurred directly beneath the region. The debris from the collapsed mountain rushed into the Ariake Sea, causing a huge tsunami over ten meters high. At the same time the debris reclaimed part of the sea and created a unique landscape called "Nagare-yama" (floating mountains).




Kyushu Olle

The concept of "Olle" comes from South Korea's Jeju Island, where the word means "a narrow alleyway leading from a road to a house" in the island's local language. Of course the word has always been well known on the island, but after a trekking course was named after it, the name became famous throughout the country. The attraction of "Olle" is the enjoyable walking experience that takes you through nature and among houses and streets on your way around the coast, through towns, and up into the mountains.

Japan's newest mountain, Heisei Shinzan, is visible from the geopark-themed Shimabara Course. As you gaze across the island and landscapes formed during the 1792 eruption, and see the remains of the damage inflicted by the latest five-year eruption that occurred from 1990, you can start to imagine what it must be like to live in the shadow of an active volcano.


The course takes in both the coastline and mountains, offering magnificent views of mountains and the sea, mountains and the town, and the sea and the town.



Early in the morning of 22nd February 1864, Katsu Kaishu and Sakamoto Ryoma placed their first step in Shimabara on the stone stairs of Shimabara Port. Shimabara-Naiko has long been used as a ship harbor. Especially during the Meiji period, the harbor flourished as a shipment

Matsudaira Collection (Shimabara Library)

The site of the residence of Matsudaira Kageyu, the chief minister of the Shimabara Domain, is currently used by the Shimabara Library. On the Second Floor, there is the "Matsudaira Collection" consisting of important classical documents from the Shimabara Domain. The collection includes approximately 10,000 books and documents. Many of these are very important historical materials and draw the attention of researchers from around the country. Non-researchers can also make use of this collection.

Three Houses (Yamamoto House, Sinozuka House and Torita House) are open to public, free of charge. Visitors can glimpse into the lives of the samurai families in the old days.

Moritake Shopping Street

There are many old townhouses on either side of this shopping street full of nostalgic atmosphere. You can stroll the street, appreciating the street lamps and information boards with the motif of Dosojin (roadside gods).



Small islets in the Ariake Sea were created as a result of the collapse of Mayuyama caused by the great earthquake in the final phase of the volcanic activity in 1792. You can see these islets from here.

This octagonal tower was built in 1909 by Gonsho Hirota, the founder of the Rissho-in Taishido temple, from donations that were collected from Karayuki-san [Japanese women sent overseas for prostitution in the late 19th century to early 20th century]. It is a very rare structure that has a double spiral staircase inside the building.




🔼 Nirvana Statue at Kotoji Temple

"San jubanshin Statues (30 god statues)" at Gokokuji Temple

Matsudaira Tadami, the lord of Shimabara Domain, had thirty master swordsmiths make one god statue each. Every January and August, there is a festival to pray for the Sanjubanshin Statues.



This is the family temple of the Matsudaira Family. In the garden of the temple, there is the graveyard of the Matsudaira Family and Sixteen Luohan Cave as well as the headless jizo statues. The red gate is the oldest structure in Shimabara.


